# **Key Retail Indicators**

Total Taxable Sales	\$677,296,712	17.43% increase compared to 2017

# **Population**

Population change is another key factor influencing local retail sales performance. Altoona's population based on 2021 estimates is 20,705 and has increased nearly 12% in the last five years. The population in Altoona is growing at a far faster rate than Polk County (a 4.9% increase since 2017), and the State of Iowa (a 1.7% increase since 2017).

# **Retail Spending**

Altoona's average sales per capita are \$32,712 the second highest in a peer group of 21 cities that includes West Des Moines, Cedar Rapids, Davenport, Coralville, and Des Moines. Altoona's average sales per capita are more than double the State of Iowa, and 53% higher than the peer group average.

#### **Trade Area**

Altoona is estimated to have brought in \$362 million of spending by non-residents (which is 53% of annual sales), satisfying the retail needs of 44,527 people. In the last five years, retail spending by non-residents has totaled more than \$2.1 billion. And, with a population of 20,705, this means the retail trade area of Altoona includes approximately 23,822 consumers that do not live in Altoona, indicating Altoona as a strong retail destination.

## **Sales by Business Group**

While there is no data for retail spending by type of business for individual municipalities, the research does show how Polk County's retail spending compares to the State of Iowa. As shown below, Polk County outspends the State in every category.

Compared to 2021, Polk County saw increases in retail spending across several business groups. The largest increases were seen in miscellaneous, motor vehicle, and utilities and transportation. The business groups with decreases compared to 2021 were general merchandise and service.
